The theme of 2023's Children's Mental Health Week, which occurred back in the second week of February, was 'Let's Connect'. That resonated with me mainly because I have spoken before on the power of communities and how forming meaningly connections is beneficial to us.

One may underestimate the power that a sense of community has. Especially when you move into a new area or take a mental health turn. Communities do not have to be exclusive clubs that require membership, but rather a simple open-arms gesture to those around you. These can be from your neighbours to the people you encounter on the local high street – and in recent times, high streets are struggling.

I thought that for this issue, I would re-emphasise the need for community and a sense of belonging. And this comes off the back of several businesses announcing their imminent, or immediate, closure.

For example, at the back end of January, Daniel Farm in Wylam heartbreakingly announced its closure. The site, which included a tearoom, fun farm, gift shop and garden centre, was a favourite for families, as it offered a lot of events for children. The news was hit with a lot of sadness over social media, with one visitor saying, "It is a great shame to lose a valuable part of the community."

In February, Run Unlimited in Prudhoe announced its own closure news. The store was known for selling running gear and for its motivational games such as treasure hunts to keep runners inspired. It's such as shame, especially in the run-up to the Great North Run. The news was met with great empathy towards the business.

And those aren't the only businesses that are closing, in recent months my favourite tea shop Tea Sutra in Newcastle sold its business, and the River Beat restaurant in Gateshead confirmed its closure. I'm sure that there are businesses I haven't mentioned who have also closed.

Whilst I wish the owners of these businesses luck for their futures, I can't help but grieve their loss. Places like these inspire adventure and fun, whilst nurturing positive memories for a lot of people.

But with rising energy and fuel costs for everyone, it's understandable. The "death of the high street" has become a well-worn political and economic trope. In today's world, the value of the high street is determined by monetary value, but its most important feature is its aid in the overall sense of community.

Online shopping may be convenient, with the act being able to take place with a mere click of the finger all from the comfort of a bed, but it lacks that unique experience. Going in person to a shop allows connections to grow between the seller and the customer, conversations take place in real-time instead of with Al Chatbots, and you can try before you buy – which also saves time and energy because you don't have to send things back.

We all know these benefits, but our high streets need our support more than ever before.

#### So, how can we help?

- Charities and fundraising.
   If you are able, donating or fundraising on their behalf can be a huge help. You can also offer your time by volunteering. Volunteering in general offers you the ability to not only help but meet new people and forge new connections.
- 2. Experiencing what your local high street and community has to offer. Whilst I have lived in this area all my life, I constantly discover new

experiences and places. I've recently gotten my driving license too which opens doors to widening my sense of community. Pop into your local coffee shop, walk around the community and see what the local area has to offer. Chat with people in local markets and fairs, and you might just discover your new favourite place or your new favourite small business.

There are plenty of ways to discover new events and groups, for example, the What's On pages of this very magazine, or the wealth of information on the internet and social media sites.

- 3. The power of social media and recommendations. A free service to help small businesses is sharing on social media, tagging the business and offering a review. Word of mouth goes a long way. Be kind and courteous and you'll be thanked in kind by the business. Liking a page or a post also only takes a mere second to do.
- 4. Communication and Conversations Don't be afraid to reach out to get recommendations either. Have new conversations, and you may find a shared interest with someone new. Open yourself up to new ways of communicating as well. For example, learning sign language or another language opens up experiences with people of different abilities and cultures, which all aids in widening the community.

A community should be accessible to all, no matter your background or your abilities.

5. Be a good neighbour. Loneliness has increased for everyone in the last few years, with economic struggles and with the pandemic. By befriending or offering companionship to the more vulnerable in your area, you can help foster a real sense of community and connection. And that goes both

Helping someone else will help increase the 'social capital' in your area by creating a network of support for people to draw on in times of struggle. If you are able to do so, offer to collect medication or groceries for your elderly neighbours, walk someone's dog or have a regular chat with nearby friends and relatives.

These simple actions can make a world of difference to those around you. It takes people coming together to create a strong community spirit. Having a full high street helps with the community, and gives people somewhere to turn to. We need to do all that we can to save that and keep building our communities up as we do so.

It's a mutual relationship, if we prop our communities up, they will respond in kind. It's a win, win situation, and we just need to make the effort.



You may recall from one of my previous articles, we talked about leading lines when composing your shot. This is particularly useful in landscape photography, but of course, can also be utilised to great effect in other genres too. Its well worth going into this topic in a little more detail as I feel it can really be the difference to a successfully composed shot and one that just doesn't work

As I said before, when we read text, we generally read from left to right. (I know, in some languages, it's the other way round, but for our purposes we will assume left to right), and thus, our eyes are trained to view images in a similar way. Leading lines in an image, if used well, will draw your viewer's eyes through the image and will help tell the story you want them to see and can be a very powerful compositional tool. The lines need not be straight. Strong lines, diagonal or horizontal, straight or curved, can help to make a stronger composition, as long as they take the viewer to what you want them to see. This should be a focal point in your image, a lone tree perhaps, or a building, or maybe, a person in the distance. A strong leading line can help take your viewer through your image and directly to the focal point. In my own photography, particularly with landscape images, I really like, if possible, to have a person in my image somewhere. My wife comes in very handy for this in many cases! Often when we are out walking, I'll hang back until she walks into the position I want her to be in, or I just ask her to go stand in a strategic

place! As a fellow photographer, she understands! Using a figure in your shot can add some human interest and also adds scale, as well as a focal point for your leading lines to point to. You can see some examples of this in the accompanying images.

There are different types of leading lines you can use:

Horizontal lines: Often found in nature and landscapes. Since these horizontal leading lines can often stretch across the width of the image, they tend to be used when shooting with a wide-angle lens.

Diagonal lines: Commonly used to create a sense of movement and dynamism. They can help to emphasize a sense of distance and often can be used to accentuate the sense of depth within your image.

Vertical lines: They can draw the eye up or down within the frame and can be used to convey status and a sense of power within your image. Vertical leading lines are often found in fashion, architectural or street photography. Converging lines: Can be very powerful if used in the right way. If there are converging lines present in your frame, use them to lead directly to the main subject of the image at the point where they meet. A very powerful tool too, in architectural work with tall buildings.

When you look around, there is nearly always something you can use as a leading line. Some good examples of strong leading lines could be; a fence or hedgerow in a landscape, a road, track or winding forest path in amongst trees, a railing or railway tracks, a pier leading to a lighthouse or even lines/edges of a building or architectural detail, all can be used as a leading line. Diagonal lines can work especially well, when used in the right way. One other thing to consider is Shadows! When shooting in strong sunlight, which direction is the light and where are the shadows? Can you use those shadows as leading lines in your shot? Perhaps your own shadow can create a strong compositional leading line if you stand in the right place. Think too about changing your viewpoint. Crouch down lower, or stand on something to create a higher perspective, (but stay safe!)

Leading lines are not only useful in landscape photography. You can use them in, for example, portrait photography too. Body parts such as hands, arms, legs, the bridge of a nose and fingers etc. can all be used as an effective leading line to draw your view to the subject's eyes which, generally, are the focal point of any good portrait. When taking a portrait, think about what poses you could use to make your viewer 'read' through the image and follow those leading lines to the eyes. Keep in mind too, though, the other composition 'rules' we discussed previously such as the rule of thirds. If you don't, you can sometimes find your leading line may lead the viewer right out of the image and you lose them, or at least they lose interest in your shot.

Whichever genre of photography you prefer, think about what you want the viewer to take from your shot and try to use some leading lines to take them there. So learn your lines, but above all, have fun and enjoy it!



## The Digital Pound: Convenience at the Cost of Individual Freedom..

Most of you have probably noticed that the use of cash has been diminishing for the last ten years as technology evolves and more people use contactless cards, Apple Pay, online banking and other kinds of rapidly evolving technology. Covid-19 and the government-imposed lockdowns of 2020 and 2021 were also used as an excuse to increase our dependency on digital and electronic payments. The Bank of England and the HM treasury have recently published a consultation paper on creating a digital pound and will have it up and running by the end of the decade. So today we will look at the difference between cash and other kinds of payments and how it could affect your freedom of action.

As of now there are basically two kinds of currency. The first is the deposits held at privately-owned commercial banks. This money is created by the private sector banks whenever you take out a loan and your account is credited by the bank. Believe it or not this money is conjured up out of thin air and written down on the bank's ledger as a credit on to your account. The second type is the Central Bank or public currency which you may opt to withdraw from your bank deposits at a branch or an ATM. These notes and coins are what we call cash and everything else is card payments and other. So why should we be concerned, in my opinion, about the disappearance of notes and coins and the possible extinction of these forms of payment?

We need to go back in time and perform the Austrian School of Economics and Ludwig von Mises' regression theorem analysis of money. Before money, people were subsistent farmers or hunter gatherers and bartered value for value. The commodities and items they directly exchanged were their private property and did not belong to anybody else. Eventually as societies advanced and trade grew, merchants found that some commodities were desired by almost everybody so these commodities could act as sort of money and allowed for indirect exchange. Usually these marketable commodities have been precious metals like silver and gold as they were portable, relatively scarce, durable and a good store of value.

So how come we have gotten away from real cash or gold and silver coins? I would say that money has been gradually hijacked by Central Banks and governments and it has been a slow but steady process. The original function of the state was to mint the coins or cash in order to ensure that they were of a certain weight of gold and silver. The state mints usually received what was called a seignorage or a small percentage of the gold and silver minted into coins. U.S. law for example, Under the Coinage Act of 1792, should provide the public with a minting service. Back before FDR banned gold in 1933 you could take gold and silver jewellery or bullion to your local mint and have coins minted for a small fee. Here in the U.K. the monetary system began to

be hijacked back in 1694 with the creation of the Bank of England. Over the centuries the Bank and HM Treasury have worked together to finance major wars and slowly move the country away from cash or gold and silver coinage.

The cash that we still use today are actually bank notes and these are promissory notes. The goldsmiths of the City of London issued them as receipts for safeguarding clients' gold. Eventually these receipts became accepted as money or cash and they were bearer instruments which meant that anyone holding them could redeem them for gold coinage. Silver coinage usually circulated as the value of silver was lower than that of gold. The goldsmiths eventually started issuing more notes than the gold that they held as they realised a small percentage of their depositors hardly ever redeemed the notes. The goldsmiths were the original bankers and bank runs occurred when depositors lost trust and demand their money or gold back. A bank would fail if it could not pay all its depositors.

So back to the digital pound. The Bank and HM treasury's argument is that as people opt for card and other kinds of payments, bank notes will not be necessary - but the Bank needs to issue some kind of digital coin that has the credibility of a Central Bank. The authorities are aware of the privacy and anonymity questions so in the working paper it has been stated that the Bank and government will only provide the coin and will not know the identity of the owner. That sound very good until you read on to find out that the provision of the digital wallets will be outsourced to private companies or banks that will need to carry out all the KYC (Know Your Client) and AML (Anti Money Laundering) vetting of the holders of the digital pound or CBDC (Central Bank Digital Currency). If this plan succeeds it is possible the privacy and anonymity that our forefathers had in using cash and even bank notes will be lost forever and what is more your "money" will not be really 100% yours as it will be at the mercy of the digital wallet provider.







The rustic woodlands we see at Allen Banks today are largely the work of 19th-century 'wonder woman' Susan Davidson, who made it her life's purpose to develop the estate. But its history goes back to the 16th century when the Ridley family of Willimoteswick Castle owned the original Ridley Hall, the manor house of the district.

The estate changed hands more than once during the 18th and early 19th centuries until the 1830s when Mr John Davidson of Otterburn bought the estate for his wife, Susan Hussey Elizabeth Jessup. She was the granddaughter of the 9th Earl of Strathmore and here began the estate's connection to the Bowes-Lyon family.

Susan was the first Lady of Ridley known to take an interest in the garden. She laid out 65 flower beds in the formal gardens and organised the system of paths, rustic bridges and summer houses. She also carried out work on the woods by the River Allen. Susan managed and developed the estate for the next 35 years.

Susan Davidson died childless and left the property to her cousin John Bowes, the illegitimate son of the 10th Earl of Strathmore.

In 1942 Francis Bowes-Lyon gave the woodland estate to the National Trust. Now we do our best to maintain Susan's hard work so that visitors can continue to enjoy Allen Banks and Staward Gorge today.

#### Restoration and Regeneration

Some of that work at Allen Banks and Staward Gorge includes the restoration of natural woodland habitat as part of our woodland management plan to return the site to predominantly native broadleaf species, which will stimulate biodiversity.

Much of Staward Gorge woodland is a 'Plantation on an Ancient Woodland site' (PAWs). During the Second World War the original native broadleaf trees were felled as part of the war effort.

After the war, the newly barren woodland was replanted with fast-growing conifer trees that could be used should another war break out. Fortunately, this didn't happen, but in Staward Gorge it meant the timber was never felled and subsequently now dominates the landscape.

These conifers cause problems for the wildlife as their thick foliage blocks any sunlight from reaching the ground, meaning the woodland flora is not regenerating. This in turn reduces the species that can live there, including dormice and birds such as wood warblers and pied flycatchers.

The woodland currently has an even age structure with little new tree regeneration because it is too dark. This means that without intervention, all the trees will reach old age at the same time and the woodland could be lost in the future if new trees aren't able to grow to replace them now.

To enable natural regeneration, we are felling some of the conifers to let light hit the woodland floor. This allows new trees and ground flora to grow, storing carbon and water and creating a better habitat for wildlife. To give the woodland a helping hand, in some places we have planted new trees to increase species diversity.

Where possible, the felled trees are extracted from the woodland and used to make timber products such as fence posts or used as a biofuel. Where this can't be done, the timber is left as deadwood habitat, great for bugs and fungi which feed some of the birds and mammals living in the wood. This work forms part of a 10-year woodland plan which includes big





interventions like those mentioned above but also smaller jobs such as waste thinning and putting in coops; a process of punching a hole in the woodland to let light in.

Increasing species and structural diversity means the woodland becomes more resilient to climate change, pests and disease

as well as being more biodiverse. This means an increase in the numbers and types of mammals, birds and insects as well as flowers and trees.

A functioning woodland needs to be constantly changing and our wild places must be managed to keep them healthy and thriving for future generations to enjoy.





# How Meditation Can Help Our Mental Health

We live in difficult times. The talk about mental issues and how difficult it can be to get help is growing, and getting help is indeed more difficult. While some mental issues require professional intervention and supervision, there are many ways in which we can take a pre-emptive approach and nip the development of mental issues in the bud.

Many mental health issues are just bad or negative attitudes that have turned into deeply ingrained negative habits of thinking. Those with genuine interest can help themselves to resolve mental pain and difficulties. It is all about being aware of our mental habits and changing them. This is what meditation does.

Meditation is a mental activity which allows us to become aware of our mental habits - our thoughts and feelings; develop a healthy distance from these thoughts and feelings, and finally transform these thoughts and feelings into peaceful, productive and more helpful attitudes and habits of mind

#### \*\*Awareness\*\*

This is the first training - being aware of our thoughts and feelings. This means we need to notice how we feel and ask our self, "what are the thoughts I am having"? It turns out that in most cases, unless we have a real traumatic situation, the main reason for our having bad mental experiences or bad feelings is the presence of negative thoughts. \*A negative thought is a thought that gives you mental pain\*. It is the thought itself that is painful! Because this point is difficult to understand please think about it carefully.

Our habitual negative thinking is responsible for much of our mental pains and problems. If we are aware of this, we can then start thinking of ways to stop these bad mental habits.

Being aware and discovering how the pain comes from our thoughts and not from the situation is the first step of meditation.

#### \*\*Putting distance between our self and our thoughts and feelings\*\*

The next step is to come and realize that we can observe our own thoughts and feelings. If we train like this we shall see that we can create some distance between ourself and our thoughts and feelings. This is an important step because otherwise it is like we are drowning in the negativity and cannot develop different perspectives on situations. Without this distance, we cannot transform the bad mental habit.

As we become aware of our mental habits - especially the negative ones, we should think to ourself - "This is not me, this is just a thought in my mind, like a cloud in the sky or like a wave in the ocean". In this way we develop some distance between us and our thoughts.

#### \*\*Transforming our thoughts\*\*

Once we are aware of our negative habits of mind and gained some distance from them, we are no longer controlled by them. We have a bit of mental breathing space, we can try and transform the situation through transforming our mind.

To transform our mind - move it out of a habit or pattern it is used too, we can try few things

\*Imagine the situation from the other person's point of view\* - say we are in stressful situation involving another person or people, try imagining what do they see; try imagining what causes them to behave in the way they do. Such training of your imagination often helps in empathizing with the other person and this empathy can reduce much of our pain or other



issues. The ability to develop empathy or compassion for more and more people is a vital component of mental health.

\*Imagine the situation from the point of view of your future self -\* If we observe our own mind and the behaviours it engenders, we can try imagining what impact would this have on our future self, would out future self appreciate what we just thought, said or did?

-This is very helpful because when we realize that our future self will suffer because of our present bad mental attitudes and habits we will have strong motivation to stop them.

\*Find logical reasoning to help you deal with difficult situations\* - Sometimes we find our self in difficult situations, at work, at home, with our health and so on. We can become aware that we are stressed with the situation and we can develop some distance from the situation. With awareness and distance we can apply logic. We can think this situation will change, sooner or later it will go, and so I don't need to fight it or worry about it, I can stay peaceful and in its own time this situation will pass

In short I hope I have laid the basics of what meditation, showing it is a practical training of our own mind. There is nothing mystical about it and you can do it anywhere anytime. Even though it is simple it is very profound and you may find that the best way to start your own meditation practice you should find a meditation group and meditate with like minded people. This is one of the best ways to gain control over our mind and improve our mental health.

At Compassion Centre we teach how to meditate and how to deal with difficult situations. But there are many other groups that will help you learn to meditate.

My visit to GO Local Food's Ovington fields coincided with the windiest day of the year (so far) - though Storm Otto was gusting less than expected. The growers had been busy the day before placing bricks on the five polytunnels, though higher up the valley the fields are fairly sheltered, and a large hedge and an additional pine tree belt provide good cover. Despite the gusts, the weather was warm and bright for February, with great views south to the Tyne Valley, looking

over to Stocksfield and Mickley on the other side.

I had never heard of "moon planting" until I visited for the first quarterly walk of '23. Ian Todd, one of the two contracted horticulturists explained "There are real benefits to sowing seeds at or just before the full moon. Even with the low light there is enough for a plant to photosynthesise at night and through the filter of a polytunnel". He went further to explain that "weeding is then best done at the new moon period where there is less light, as is transplanting seedlings. When transplanting it is best to encourage growth slowly and steadily which you wouldn't get at a full moon".

Quarterly walks provide a chance to learn and share more about the fields and polytunnels, and to discover what seasonal crops are on their way to our bags and baskets. As lan got to work in the shelter of the polytunnels we chatted through this quarter's crop rotation. The growing year is split into four crop rotations of plants to harvest. Currently, the growers are busy preparing seedlings for this summer's harvest. "This is pricking out. I need to be very gentle not to pinch the stems" lan explained as he very tenderly singled out cauliflower seedlings from a tray that had been in the polytunnel for 3 to 4 weeks. "The seeds were propagated back in January in the gas-heated propagating shed at around 16 to 20 degrees and are now ready to be placed into individual pods, one per seedling". Seedlings will be kept in the polytunnels providing the ideal halfway house before planting them outside when the ground is ready. "These cauliflowers will be ready to harvest around July time, along with the onions, alliums, oriental greens and pak choi that are already in the queue".

The most striking feature of the polytunnels is the thirty or more hanging baskets which had fresh green leafy endive growing in them, making the most of every available space and will be ideal for a winter salad. It looked like a very good way of keeping the slugs out of the beautifully lush-looking lettuces.

The fields, at their quietest right now, with only sparse amounts of spring onions, brussels sprouts, overwintering cauliflower, and garlic, confirming as we might imagine, that, "February is more focused on growing in the polytunnels and preparing fields for summer harvesting. The cold snaps in December and the pre-Christmas frosts affected the overwintering crops; brassicas especially the kale, and the cauliflower all bursting, however, garlic likes frost, so we have plenty of that".

The newly built lottery-funded wooden "Shed-Quarters" offered a



welcome break for coffee and more conversation. Several of the volunteers and workshares were also having a break from harvesting. There were several stories of the 'the veg that got away!' otherwise known as harvesting challenges. For example, the case of when a giant runner bean grew to over 12 inches after having been missed by the harvesters. "Tomatoes are the easiest to harvest" explained Ann, with Ian joking that, "beans are easiest to hide!" The best technique involves running your hand along the row of plants".

It was evident that the social and community aspect of the cooperative is as important as the growing side, and the turnover of volunteers and workshares is extremely low. Sue, a workshare, also noted "incredibly, in the few years I have been involved only 4 days of harvesting have been lost to severe weather". Weather forecasts help in planning the workload and there are always jobs to be done in the polytunnels if it is raining.

Interestingly, after seeing an advert in the Tyne Valley Express 3 years ago, Ann one of the harvesting team volunteered. "I was looking for something to do after I retired. Volunteering whilst learning just looked perfect for me". Ann often cycles the 22-mile round trip from Ponteland to the fields and reflected on how much she enjoys the camaraderie with the other members. "One of the real benefits has been learning about the various recipes you can make with the different crops. There are so many different styles of cooks it is incredible what you learn". With over 100 members in total, there is a considerable knowledge base of talents within GO Local Food.

Next time I will be meeting Jala Haidar Go Local Food's other horticulturist for a catch-up of the Spring harvest.

Spring is just around the corner, and with it brings the busiest season in a gardener's calendar. Preparing your garden for the year ahead is crucial to ensuring a good crop, and this is also when you can enjoy the beautiful colours and fragrant blooms the season brings.

Whether you're a gardening pro, or just starting your planting journey, Dobbies' Horticultural Director, Marcus Eyles has outlined his top tips to inspire you to 'spring' into gardening. What's more, Marcus says you don't need to spend a fortune to get your outdoor space looking its best and there are some great value options that will help you spend less while still getting the most out of your garden.

#### Spring clean and prepare

Spring cleaning your garden is an essential first step when it comes to preparing for the year ahead, and if you have been tidying and maintaining your garden throughout the winter months, this will stand you in good stead. One of the easiest ways to tidy up your garden is by neatening your beds and borders for the growing season, hoeing to remove weeds and applying a good layer of mulch over the surface. Marcus notes that not only will mulching help lock in moisture, but it will give your plants a nutrient boost for spring.

Deciduous grasses that have been left over winter to protect wildlife can be cut back now to make way for new season growth, and Marcus recommends raking growth of everygreen grasses to remove any dead foliage.

#### Design your beds and borders

Spring is the ideal time to get your beds and borders in shape for the warmer months. Once you have removed weeds, the next step is to trim back any winter flowering plants such as Cornus and Salix where blooms have started to fade and prune summer flowering shrubs like Buddleia, Lavatera and hardy Fuschias to allow room for new growth. As we get into spring, Marcus recommends pruning early spring flowering shrubs once flowering has finished, as this will give your beds and borders a tidier look. Wisteria can be pruned to encourage strong flower buds by cutting side shoots back to just a few buds.

To give your garden structure, Marcus also recommends planting new container grown shrubs, hedges, and trees in spring. You should also tend to your evergreen trees, shrubs and hedges by feeding them with a slow-release general-purpose fertiliser, lightly forked into your borders.

#### Plant bulbs for summer colour

One of the most enjoyable spring gardening jobs is undoubtedly planting, and Dobbies has a wide selection of great plants that can be grown quickly in warmer soil for earlier blooms.

Summer flowering bulbs like Dahlias, Lilies and Gladioli can be planted in spring for a burst of colour and fragrance in the summer months, and make great cut flowers for the home. Begonia corms can also be planted now in containers for early summer colour.

Hardy annuals such as Love-in-the-Mist or English Marigold can be sown directly into borders now for a wonderful flower display later in the year. Marcus says that now is also the perfect time to plant new Roses – he recommends David Austin English Roses – for a blooming summer display that will transform your garden with their performance. Just ensure you prune existing Rose bushes back hard before the new season leaves begin to unfurl.

#### Grow your own produce

Marcus recommends removing any weeds from your vegetable beds before mulching with peat-free soil improver and covering with black weed membrane. This will help warm up the soil, making it easier for spring planting.

Marcus says you should start chitting (sprouting) your first early potatoes in trays in January/ Feburary so they are ready to plant in March. The easiest way to do this is to stand them in an egg box in a frost-free shed or garage to encourage new shoots to form.

Sweet Peas can be sown now under cover in a greenhouse, ready for planting out in April. To speed up germination, Marcus suggests soaking your seeds for 24 hours in tepid water and allowing two seeds per pot to allow room for growth. Kale, Tomatoes, Aubergines, Broad Beans and Cucumber seeds can also be sown under cover for a summer harvest.

Soft fruits such as rhubarb, raspberries, blackcurrants, and blueberries can all be planted in spring too, as can strawberry plants. If you're planting apricots, peaches and nectarines, Marcus recommends protecting them from any late frosts with a layer of fleece, as cold temperatures can cause damage to their blossom and therefore no fruit will set.

#### Refresh your pots

To ensure instant colour in your garden for the new season, Marcus recommends refreshing your pots, hanging baskets and window boxes with early season Primroses, Violas and Pansies, planting potted spring bulbs in the gaps for an extra burst of colour.

One of Marcus's favourite and most economical ways to ensure your containers are full of colour as early as possible is to grow your own bedding plants from young plants. You can plant these immediately into small pots filled with peat-free young plant compost to be grown in a warm greenhouse, conservatory or bright windowsill, and then plant outside when the risk of frost has passed.

#### Lawncare

Depending on the weather, early spring is the time to prepare your lawn ready for sowing by cultivating soil and making sure the area is level and firm. If you prefer the look of a manicured lawn, you can also use this time to straighten lawn edges with an edging iron and get the area looking neat. In late spring, you can apply a lawn feed high in nitrogen to established lawns to encourage growth. Once you see growth, you can give it the first light cut of the season, making sure the blades are kept on their highest setting so as not to scalp the lawn.


